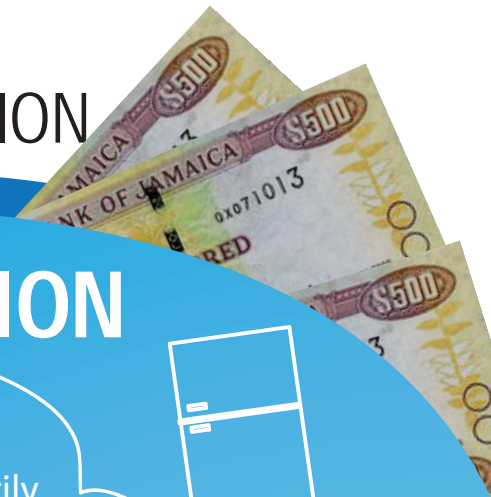




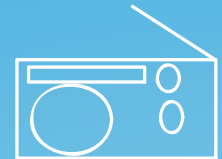
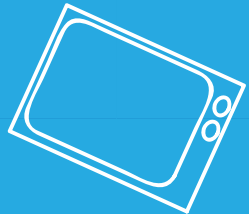

The latest surge in energy prices, due primarily to the unrest in the Oil producing nations of the Middle East and North Africa is likely to cause some pain. However ***we are tallawah*** and there are things that we can do to temper the effects. We must conserve and use energy more efficiently. The total amount on your utility bill is determined by the amount of electricity used.



Here are some conservation tips:

- Use compact fluorescent bulbs
- Don't open and close the refrigerator too often.
- Cool hot foods before putting them inside your refrigerator.
- Don't place refrigerator near a heat source (stove or dryer).
- Iron only once per week.
- Switch off appliances (television sets, radios etc.) when not in use.
- Use your audio systems wisely. The louder the volume, the more energy used.
- Unplug products that are not in use for instance cell phone charger.
- Use a fan instead of air-conditioning whenever possible.
- Switch off the air conditioner a while before you leave the room. You will still be cool.
- Plan your errands so that you will drive less and save on petrol.
- Reduce expenditure on non-essential items.
